# PATTERN OF ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION DURING THE SESSION

## Important points to be noted:

- 1. It is mandatory to appear in all periodic tests and terminal examinations.
- 2. No retest shall be conducted in case of outstation leave. However, it is MANDATORY TO SEND AN APPLICATION in a proper format stating the reason for absence within three working days of the leave taken.
- 3. Re-test will be conducted for those students who participate in any competition on the day of the exam.
- 4. In genuine medical cases, an application along with a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner should be submitted within three working days of the leave taken.
- 5. A minimum of 75% attendance is required for the student to appear in the final examination.
- 6. If a student is found cheating, he/she shall not be considered for any scholarship for the current as well as the next session. Also no retest will be taken in such cases.
- 7. In case of school being functional in the on-line mode, reforms and decisions regarding evaluation made by the school authorities will be final and binding.

# **EVALUATION PATTERN**

Assessment during the session will be as follows:

## **CLASSES PRE-SCHOOL to II**

Evaluation is an integral part of the teaching learning process. Our emphasis is on continuous and comprehensive assessment of the overall growth and development of the child - physical, mental, social, emotional and spiritual. The child's progress is measured by the teacher's on-going observation over the year.

For classes III to XII, the academic session will comprise of two terms, Term-1 (March-September) and

Term-2 (October- February).
